



A FEAST OF FLOYD

A double whammy for Floyd fans – a Syd Barrett documentary and Pulse DVD release for 2006



2006 is set to be a great year for fans of the almighty Pink Floyd. David Gilmour's solo album and tour is just around the corner, while two more treats will also surface. Firstly there is the long-anticipated and oft-delayed release of the band's live DVD, Pulse. Comprising footage from Floyd's spectacular Earl's Court show in 1994, and originally released on VHS, the two-disc DVD includes sound remastered by the band's engineer James Guthrie and a plethora of bonus features, including screen films, rare bootleg

performances, videos, short films, photos and behind-the-scenes footage. Pink Floyd In Concert: Pulse will see a September release.

Floyd fans will also be intrigued by the DVD release of The Pink Floyd And Syd Barrett Story Definitive Edition, a re-released version of John Edginton's BBC Omnibus documentary from 2001 which Syd himself thought was, "pretty good, actually." The two-DVD package includes over three hours of extras and 'Director's Cut' interviews with the rest of the band and it's out now.
